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Dr. Denburg's research focuses on the political, ethical and economic dimensions of child health policy, in both local and global contexts. His doctoral research examines normative and methodological issues in the assessment of child health technologies, with specific focus on pharmaceutical policy and drug coverage decisions for children. Dr. Denburg serves as Chair of the Essential Medicines Working Group for the International Society of Pediatric Oncology (SIOP), and is co-founder and Health Policy Lead of the Sick Kids Research Unit for Policy and Economics Research in Childhood Cancer (PERCC).
