Dr. Patricia Tang is a medical oncologist at the Tom Baker Cancer Centre and a Clinical Associate Professor at the Cumming School of Medicine at the University of Calgary. She specializes in the treatment of breast and gastrointestinal malignancies.

Patricia obtained her Bachelor of Medical Science Degree (Distinction) and Medical Doctorate (Distinction with Honours in Research) from the University of Alberta where she also completed her internal medicine training. After medical oncology residency at the University of Calgary, she completed an Investigational New Drug Fellowship at Princess Margaret Hospital, University of Toronto. As the Provincial Gastrointestinal Cancer Tumour Group Leader for Alberta, she is involved in development of clinical practice guidelines and pathways.

Patricia is the centre representative to the Canadian Cancer Clinical Trials Group for Calgary, a member of the OICR Clinical Trials Subcommittee, and was awarded the Ralph Meyer Phase III Program Young Investigator Award in 2016. She has reviewed grants for Breast Cancer Now (UK), the Saskatchewan Cancer Agency, the Canadian Breast Cancer Foundation, and Pancreatic Cancer Canada. Dr. Tang's research interests include clinical trials and health services research. She is a co-investigator on Canadian Institutes of Health Research and Terry Fox Research Initiative funded grants.

A member of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada Nucleus Committee for Medical Oncology, Patricia received the 2016 Luminary Award for Teaching in the Department of Oncology.
